As we finish the 2024 reporting and associated paperwork, we look back at all we have accomplished, and there is a lot to be proud of. Once again there have been many of you this past year who have accomplished a lot and have obtained certifications as EMT's, EMR's, Drivers, and Fire Officers. I am very proud of everyone's hard work and dedication.

Thanks to Lt. Dan Brown for continuing to do a fantastic job of recruiting and bringing in 7 combat volunteers and for all the hard work of organizing and running the Academy. There is a huge amount of work that goes on behind the scenes to make the Academy go. I also want to give a big thanks to all the volunteers and staff that give up their weekends to instruct and assist training these new volunteers. Training new volunteers is one of the most vial programs we have and it is one of the most rewarding and important things our members do as trainers and mentors.

The 2025 Training Academy starts Friday, January 3rd with 10 students; 7 from Silverton, 2 Monitor, and 1 Drakes Crossing.

I want to give a huge "shout out" to Lt. Ray Dandeneau for his leadership and tireless dedication in running a successful Food and Toy Drive again this year. His efforts continue to produce huge food and toy donations which coupled with his partnerships with Zenith Women's Club, SACA and several other community groups, go to help hundreds of families in the Silver Falls School District. Thank you Lt. Dandeneau!

Winter is upon us! Let's enjoy those cool nights safely. If you are using a space heater, I urge you to do it safely. Establish a three-foot kid and pet-free zone around the heater, and never put a heater inside a child's room. Keep your space heater at least three feet away from combustible materials, and make sure you turn the heater off when you go to bed or leave the room.



As we reflect on the past year, let's remember the importance of community and the strength that we share. Your commitment to fire prevention, emergency preparedness, and looking out for each other plays a crucial role in making our communities a safer place to live.

Updates Around the District

FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Project:

The district received a grant for new NFPA 1851 complaint PPE extractors and dryers. The scope of this project includes two new extractors with chemical pumps, two new drying

cabinets and required facility upgrades such as plumbing and electrical work. Contractors have been selected and the facility upgrades are well under way. I estimate this project to be completed in early February.

FEMA AFG Grant Application:

The most recent FEMA AFG grant application period has also opened and closed. After careful consideration, we selected the scope of this project to include replacement of our SCBA filling station and compressor unit. Our current unit has been well maintained and has served us well; however, the unit is approximately 25 years old. This grant application was submitted as a regional grant in partnership with Drakes Crossing Fire District. It is not clear when the grant review process will begin and potential award notifications will be made, but we will keep the membership informed.

SPIRE Program Award:

Last year, the district was awarded a grant from Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) under the SPIRE program. The scope of the award is a fuel transport trailer. OEM recently reached out to report that they are currently

entering into the procurement process to purchase the trailers. Our intent is to utilize this trailer during a potential disaster to facilitate going outside the district to obtain fuel if our supply becomes depleted in district to ensure emergency response and disaster mitigation/recovery efforts can occur.

B407:

The new B407 project is moving along. We have submitted our order to purchase the chassis (RAM 5500). More updates to come!

Upcoming Events and Information

- Once the new PPE extractors/dryers have been installed, we will be delivering training on the operation of the new equipment.
- Academy '25 has started! Lots of help is always needed to help instruct. Please contact Lt. Dan Brown if you are interested!
- Officers Testing: The district will soon announce an officers testing promotional process. Once completed, successful candidates will be places onto an eligibility list and/or into currently vacant positions. More information to come!

Thank you for all your good work. Let's continue to support one another as we move forward into 2025!




DRILL PARTICIPATION



FIRE PREVENTION AND PUBLIC EDUCATION UPDATE

Silverton Fire District recently installed a life-saving device: a bed shaker alarm for a local resident!

This specialized alarm is designed to assist individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing by providing an alternative way to be alerted during a fire emergency. Instead of detecting smoke itself, the bed shaker is activated when it hears a smoke alarm in the home. Once triggered, the device emits strong vibrations under the mattress and may include a flashing light, ensuring the user is alerted even when sleeping.

These devices play a crucial role in making fire safety accessible to everyone in our community. By ensuring all residents have equal opportunity for early fire detection, we're reducing risks and improving outcomes during emergencies. If you know someone who could benefit from an adaptive smoke alarm, have them contact our office for more information. Together we can make our community safer!
